Living their faith, Mission

When Dr. Juan Gonzalez and his wife Silvia and their little boys Gabriel and Paolo set out to serve at Karoli Lwanga Hospital in Uganda, their journey was inspired by a deep faith and a shared commitment to providing care for those most in need.

Because of your generosity, they have brought healing and hope to many while learning profound lessons in resilience, faith, and community.

Dr. Juan and his wife felt called to pursue mission work after a year-long global health fellowship in Africa. They searched for a Catholic mission that aligned with their faith, eventually finding MDA. "We felt very blessed by the support and guidance we received from MDA," Juan shares. "From our first contact, through retreats, and now in service, they have been with us every step of the way."

Their faith not only guided their decision, but continues to sustain them. "Through our faith, we know we have a special role in sharing God's love with those who are poor and suffering," he says. "It reminds us that the results are in His hands, not ours."

"Many good things come out of MDA's work," Silvia emphasizes. "With your generosity, the dialogue between MDA, its partner hospitals, and the doctors who serve can continue bearing fruits of service, learning, and charity."

As a family, preparing for their mission involved both spiritual and practical steps. Prayer was central, helping them cultivate openness and flexibility. "We prayed for guidance," Juan explains. "We knew we had to adapt to circumstances we couldn't imagine ahead of time."

Practical preparations included packing essential medical tools and personal items that would ease their transition, from a pediatric blood pressure cuff to a sturdy kitchen knife. "These small things make a big difference when resources are limited," he notes. Working in a resource-limited environment presents daily challenges, from shortages of medical supplies to patients' inability to afford treatments.

Despite these obstacles, Juan finds immense rewards in his work. "Taking care of patients, seeing them improve, and experiencing their humble gratitude is deeply fulfilling," he says.

One memorable patient was a woman suffering from a frozen shoulder, a condition unfamiliar to the local medical trainees. Juan's expertise not only relieved the patient's pain, but also introduced new knowledge to the local doctors. "Her gratitude reminded me that even modest contributions can make a meaningful impact," Juan reflects.

While Juan's medical work addresses immediate health needs, the family's involvement extends beyond the hospital. Juan and Silvia are supporting the hospital's administrator on a waste segregation and composting project, inspired by Pope Francis' Laudato si' encyclical, to reduce toxic fumes from burning trash. "This initiative will improve environmental health, and hopefully, through community education, it will inspire deeper respect and appreciation for this beautiful land" Silvia said.

Serving in Africa with two young children has been both a challenge and a blessing. "Our boys bring joy and grounding," Silvia shares. "They're learning that what they've known as 'normal' in the U.S. isn't the reality for most people around the world."

The children's presence has also fostered meaningful connections. On Gabriel's birthday, during their time serving in northern Ghana (prior to their current mission in Uganda), he embraced a local tradition of giving rather than receiving, delivering fruit to children in the pediatric ward. "It was a beautiful, touching experience that enriched all our lives," Silvia recalls.

Through their journey, Juan and Silvia have been inspired by the ingenuity and resilience of the people they serve. They've also been deeply moved by the support of MDA's donors. "Many good things come out of MDA's work," Silvia emphasizes. "With your generosity, the dialogue between MDA, its partner hospitals, and the doctors who serve can continue bearing fruits of service, learning, and charity."
